Principal's Report

Budget Report:

Breakfast Club will go until end of May 2025. There is still \$ 2,143 remaining in the budget... until the end of the school year 2025. We are in good standing.

As recommended and motioned from the previous Governing Board meeting (Nov 12, 2024), the Hull Centre will be purchasing 12 -\$100 PC gift cards - for students in need (value of \$ 1,200). The gift cards can be used at any PC stores across Quebec and Canada. Money for the gift cards will come from the rental funds \$500, donations \$500 and raffle money \$200

Governing Board would like to allocate \$1500 from rental funds towards the Winter Activity Day February 7, 2025. Potential costs for this day include food, transportation and possibly ticket fair to Winterlude locations. More details to come as Staff and Staff Council look through details.

Any funds greater than what is targeted will go toward additional gift cards for students in need.

Student Council will also be raising money for students in need. They will be hosting a bake sale on Dec 16 and 17. After recuperating costs, any profits will go toward students in need and purchasing PC gift cards.

Teacher's Report


Teachers have noticed that more students are walking the hallways, arriving late for class and leaving early. Admin will address this issue with all staff.
