- **Rental changes.**

The Centre lost approximately \$900.00 in potential revenue. This group will no longer be able to rent from the Hull Centre.

- **Summer Rental**

Scott explained the rental rate from the previous summer 2024-2025. \$5,750 plus tax. The Governing Board discussed rental rates and if they should be raised. Scott explained that many schools/ centres have much higher summer rates.

After discussion the Governing Board decided to raise the rental rate for the summer camp to \$6,000 + tax. An increase of \$250.
